This past year was a little bit difficult with low water levels in Spring and a lot of windy days on the lake, but we still had a pretty good year catching fish. April was decent catching big browns and Lakers. In May the weather wasn't



very cooperative but we still managed to have some good fishing, catching browns, Lakers and nice size steelheads. In June we started to

catch some 8 to 16 lb. kings along with steelies, Lakers and a few cohos. July was probably the hardest month to catch fish in the last 5 or 6 years. In August the water level started to go back to normal and fishing started to get better. September fishing was still a little tough, but we

caught some nice kings and cohos. Some people fished out in the lake till mid-October.

The weather continued to be a problem in the Fall with record rainfall putting too much water in the rivers, Oswego

river was running at 20,000 at times and the Salmon river over 1,000. Catfish Creek was high but fishable. We didn't have very good runs

of fish but still managed some nice kings. Late October and early November we started to get some really nice size browns, one over 17.75 lbs. and one over 18 lbs. and a bunch in between.
